Areas of Life Where Children Need Warning

While reading through the Book of Proverbs, the Bible student will notice several sections where the God-breathed writer explicitly addressed, "My son" or "My children." Since these were areas of life in which the wise man thought it appropriate to teach his children, these are also areas of life about which parents today need to teach their children. The proper application of biblical principles in these areas of life can make the difference between a faithful child and an apostate child, and/or a "glad father" and "the heaviness of his mother" (Pr. 10:1). In this article, we will consider two areas about which parents need to teach and warn their children.

The Criminal Crowd

My son, if sinners entice you, Do not consent. ¹¹If they say, "Come with us, Let us lie in wait to shed blood; Let us lurk secretly for the innocent without cause; ¹²Let us swallow them alive like Sheol, And whole, like those who go down to the Pit; ¹³We shall find all kinds of precious possessions, We shall fill our houses with spoil; ¹⁴Cast in your lot among us, Let us all have one purse" — ¹⁵My son, do not walk in the way with them, Keep your foot from their path; ¹⁶For their feet run to evil, And they make haste to shed blood. ¹⁷Surely, in vain the net is spread In the sight of any bird; ¹⁸But they lie in wait for their own blood, They lurk secretly for their own lives. ¹⁹So are the ways of everyone who is greedy for gain; It takes away the life of its owners. (Pr. 1:10-19)

The Hebrew word translated "sinners" refers to "those [who are] habitually addicted to crime," such as "thugs" or "gang members" (Smith, 476). This warning is extremely relevant in today's society because many young people, both in and out of the church, have become members of gangs. These "gangs" may not be the type that wear leather jackets and spray-paint graffiti on public buildings, but any group that lures young people away from biblical values is just as damaging so far as eternity is concerned. "Be not deceived: evil communications corrupt good manners" (1 Cor. 15:33). At least part of the reason why children join gangs can be attributed to the lack of attention many of these children receive at home. Parents must remember that their children at home are to be a priority when it comes to their time. In fact, next to a spouse (Gen. 2:24), the most important earthly relationship parents have is with their children!

These alternative-to-godly-values peer groups can offer a life of adventure (i.e., "lie in wait to shed blood," Pr. 1:11), a life of perceived authority over other, lesser beings (i.e., "swallow them alive," Pr. 1:12), a life of riches (i.e., "We shall find ... precious possessions," Pr. 1:13), and an all-for-one-and-one-for-all life of comradery (i.e., sharing "one purse," Pr. 1:14).

Those who pursue this way of life end tragically (Pr. 1:15-19). A child of wisdom must avoid these kinds of peer groups (Pr. 1:15). The life of these gangsters is a life of violence and despair (Pr. 1:16). These sinners are so blinded to their own destructive ways that they are headed to their own, self-created disaster (Pr. 1:17-18). In fact, "every one who is greedy for gain" falls into this same category and will meet the same end (Pr. 1:19). Elsewhere, the wise man wrote, "He who is greedy for gain troubles his own house" (Pr. 15:27). In contrast to the end of these sinners, "the path of the just is like the shining sun, That shines ever brighter unto the perfect day" (Pr. 4:18).

Parents and grandparents must warn their children and grandchildren against the dangers of these gangs of sinners. The best way to safeguard children and grandchildren from being attracted to gangs is for parents and grandparents to spend time with their children and grandchildren. Giving children adequate attention and a feeling of belonging in the family will greatly reduce possible attraction to gangs.

The Partying Crowd

Since many children and grandchildren fall away because they get caught up in the partying crowd, they must be taught not to choose for their friends those who love to spend their time partying. The wise man wrote, "Hear, my son, and be wise; And guide your heart in the way. Do not mix with winebibbers, Or with gluttonous eaters of meat; For the drunkard and the glutton will come to poverty, And drowsiness will clothe a man with rags" (Pr. 23:19-21).

That wine is dangerous and drunkenness is destructive is clear from Proverbs 23:29-35, but the meaning of Proverbs 23:19-21 goes deeper than that fact. "Drunkard" and "glutton" are "the epitome of the lack of discipline" (Ross, 1071). Excessive eating and drinking are usually symptoms of a deeper problem. It is the deeper problem of intemperance, or lack of self-control, that leads to the poverty of the drunkard and the glutton and all who follow their example (cf. Pr. 20:1; Isa. 28:7-8; Hos. 4:11). Excessive indulgence fills the person who parties with "drowsiness," and thus makes him or her unfit for work, and those unfit for work are eventually overcome with poverty (cf. Pr. 19:15).

Parents and grandparents must teach their children and grandchildren about the dangers of making friends of those who spend their time partying. It is popular among many in the present culture, especially among some high school and college age peers, to be known as a "partier." Parents and grandparents must teach and exemplify sobriety, self-control, and the value of an "honest day's work."

Conclusion

Our children and grandchildren are faced with many more ways of being tempted than previous generations. However, the basic instructions and warnings found in Proverbs still form a solid foundation to resist ruin in key areas of life, including those with whom we seek friendship. This wise counsel still holds true: "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, But fools despise wisdom and instruction. My son, hear the instruction of your father, And do not forsake the law of your mother; For they will be a graceful ornament on your head, And chains about your neck" (Pr. 1:7-9).



Be a safe haven; A shelter of peace, Become a place Where troubles can cease. Show her the comfort Only God can afford. Pray often with her, Together, open His Word.


Never grow weary, Keep shining your light. Serve others with love-And not just because it's what's right.
