# **Overcoming Inconveniences**

We have often heard missionaries talk about Christians in underdeveloped countries walking several miles just to attend congregational Bible study and worship, and were happy to be there (cf. Ps. 133:1). While those scenes are real, there is a huge difference between our culture and theirs. However, one thing is common: all cultures have potential inconveniences when it comes to assembling with the saints. There will be more inconveniences associated with this next phase of our construction to repair sewer lines. We must not let these inconveniences keep us from "stirring up love and good works" in the "assembling of ourselves together" (Heb. 10:24-25). Below are two thing we can do.

# Keep Going the Extra Mile

In His discussion against personal retaliation when we are wronged by others, Jesus said, "Whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two" (Mt. 5:41). The background to this was the legal right Roman soldiers had to compel others to do menial tasks (cf. Mk. 15:21), whom they sometimes abused (cf. Lk. 3:14). The principle for us today is to have a cooperative spirit that goes well beyond what is "required by law." How does this apply during our present construction? We must have a cooperative spirit that will challenge us to go beyond our comfort zone to grow spiritually (2 Pet. 3:18) and to encourage others in their spiritual growth (1 Thes. 5:11). Let us all go the "second mile" during this construction project by not complaining but by finding a way—in spite of the inconveniences—to bless others as we continue to assemble (Mt. 5:13-16).

# **Continue Seeking God First**

In His discussion about our worrying over physical necessities, Jesus said, "Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things [food, drink, and clothing] shall be added to you" (Mt. 6:33). To "seek first" is to deliberately pursue the objects mentioned as our first priority, which are the "kingdom of God" and "His righteousness." The "kingdom of God" is broader than the "church of Christ" in that it refers to God's reign, or rule (Ex. 15:18; Ps. 103:19; 145:11-13 cf. 1 Sam. 12:12), while the church refers to the final manifestation of God's reign, or rule, this side of eternity (Mt. 16:18-19 cf. Heb. 12:28). The only way we can submit to God's rule is through obedience to the gospel (cf. Acts 2:36-38, 40-41, 47). "Righteousness" can refer to God's character (Ezr. 9:15) and/or to His gospel system (Rom. 1:16-17). Since God's kingdom and righteousness are inseparable (Rom. 14:17), to seek the one is to seek the other! How does this apply during our present construction? We must not allow the inconvenience of a cramped fellowship room or a less comfortable chair dethrone our top priority to "seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness" (cf. Lk. 6:46). ♥

## Simplify

Like many people, every year I choose a word to focus on and strive towards for the next twelve months This year, the word that seemed necessary was "Simplify."

> It seems like I am perpetually Overbooked. Overcommitted. Overworked... and as a result, I am exceedingly Overwhelmed. And that is on me.

I have a hard time setting boundaries, and a book I fnished just as we rang in the New Year influenced me as I set my one word.

I am not like God in his timelessness. I am not infinite. I am human, and I AM bound by time. I NEED rest. I NEED to respect the boundary that God has placed on my body.

I have to tell myself that it is not lazy to take a break. It is not lazy to need a day off. If I am to redeem the time, I must first own up to the fact that I have spent it foolishly, trying to overspend a resource that I have no control to alter. When I say yes to everything (even if they are all good things) I leave no space to breathe and meditate. I leave no space for my family (my closest and most prioritized ministry as a wife and mother), and I leave no space for my mind to grow.

The point is, I need to learn to simplify the things in my life so that I can carve out time for what glorifies God in my schedule. Me overbooking myself does not glorify God.

"Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. "(Eph 4: 15-17)

I plan to take time to stop and rest in His word, His goodness, His love, and His promises this year. I hope you will, too.
