HOW MUCH IS ENOUGH?

God cares about His people. While Jeremiah was in and around Jerusalem and Daniel was among the courts of Babylon, Ezekiel prophesied to God's people "among the captives by the River Chebar" (Ezk. 1:1; 3:15). Ezekiel was a great example from whom we can learn how to please God. The Lord told him:

As for you, son of man, the children of your people are talking about you beside the walls and in the doors of the houses; and they speak to one another, everyone saying to his brother, "Please come and hear what the word is that comes from the LORD." ³¹So they come to you as people do, they sit before you as My people, and they hear your words, but they do not do them; for with their mouth they show much love, but their hearts pursue their own gain. ³²Indeed you are to them as a very lovely song of one who has a pleasant voice and can play well on an instrument; for they hear your words, but they do not do them. (Ezk. 33:30-32)

Let us note three truths from these verses about how much is enough to please to God. First, talking about the preacher and inviting others to hear him is not enough (Ezk. 33:30). Some people are not really interested in the truth, but like new experiences. That was one of the problems with Herod. When he saw Jesus, "he was exceedingly glad; for he had desired ... to see Him ... and he hoped to see some miracle done by Him" (Lk. 23:8). Herod was thrilled to see Jesus but not because of truth! In Athens, Paul preached about the resurrection, and philosophers wanted to hear more, not because they loved truth, but "all the Athenians and the foreigners ... spent their time in nothing else but either to tell or to hear some new thing" (Acts 17:21). Talking up the preacher and inviting others to hear the Word is good, but it is not enough to be pleasing to the Lord!

Second, hearing and enjoying the preaching is not enough (Ezk. 33:31-32a). These people "hear your words, but they do not do them ... they show much love, but their hearts pursue their own gain ... they hear your words, but they do not do them!" James wrote, "But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves," and then explained the ridiculousness of looking into a mirror and walking away from obvious changes that need to be made (Jas. 1:22-24)! We must hear and enjoy the truth, but that is not enough to please God!

Third, living God's word is enough (cf. Ezk. 33:32b). Those to whom Ezekiel prophesied did not do the will of God, but that is what God required! Another prophet, Micah, asked, "He has shown you, O man, what is good; And what does the LORD require of you But to do justly, To love mercy, And to walk humbly with your God?" (Mic. 6:8). James further wrote, "But he who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does" (cf. Jas. 1:25). Jesus said it best, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven" (Mt. 7:21).
