

# LET'S INVITE OUR FAMILY, FRIENDS & NEIGHBORS!

Recently, while reading First Peter 3:15, I made a connection that did not hit me before as it did then. Many times I have emphasized the first part of this verse, "sanctifying" God in our hearts, and on many occasions I have focused on the last part of the verse, being ready to give a defense, but the implication of both parts together is worthy of a good look. The verse reads, "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is in you, with meekness and fear" (1 Peter 3:15).



After giving practical instruction concerning husband/wife relationships (1 Pet. 3:1-7), Peter exhorted Christians to be of "one mind, having compassion for one another … knowing that you were called to this, that you may inherit a blessing" (1 Pet. 3:8-9). Immediately before our verse, Peter spoke of what needed to be done to "love life and see good days" (1 Peter 3:10-13), but then reminded his readers, "But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you are blessed. 'And do not be afraid of their threats, nor be troubled" (1 Peter 3:14 cf. Isaiah 8:12-13). To counter not being afraid, there are two general parts to First Peter 3:15. First, the command to "sanctify the Lord God in your hearts." Second, the instruction to "always be ready to give a defense."



The only imperative verb form in First Peter 3:15 is the command for Christians to set apart the Lord in their hearts. "Sanctify [regard ... as holy, ESV]" is translated from a word (*hagiazo*,  $\dot{\alpha}\gamma_{1}\dot{\alpha}\zeta_{0}$ ) that means set apart as sacred to God; make holy, consecrate; regard as sacred (John 17:17, 19; Acts 20:23; 1 Corinthians 1:2; Ephesians 5:26). It is the verb form of the word often translated "holy." It is the same imperative verb found in Jesus' model prayer to the Father, "Hallowed be Your name" (Matthew 6:9). The command to "sanctify" the Lord God, or as some translations render, "sanctify Christ as Lord" (NAS) and "regard Christ the Lord as holy" (ESV), was a request to give God first place in our hearts (cf. Matthew 6:33). God will not force His way into our hearts, but He will gladly come in when we answer His invitation (cf. Matthew 11:28-30; Luke 17:20-21; Revelation 3:20; 22:17). When the Lord is enthroned in our hearts, we cannot help but be an influence for good to all who observe us (Jeremiah 20:9; Matthew 6:13-16)!

# The Coppection

In the second part of the verse, Peter exhorted that Christians "be ready to make a defense" (1 Peter 3:15). The word translated "be ready [prepared, ESV]" (from *hetoimos*,  $\xi \tau \sigma \mu \sigma \varsigma$ ) carries the idea of being prepared so, at a moment's notice, a person stands ready (Matthew 24:44; 1 Peter 1:5). The word translated "give a defense [give an answer, KJV]" (from *apologia*,  $\dot{\alpha}\pi\sigma\lambda\sigma\gamma(\alpha)$  refers to a verbal defense; answer, reply (Acts 22:1; 25:16; 1 Corinthians 9:3; 2 Corinthians 7:11; Philippians 1:7, 16; 2 Timothy 4:16). It is the word from which "apologetics" comes. In most passages where it is used, the "defense" was in response to people who

noticed and questioned a drastic difference the way Christians lived and taught compared to world (cf. 1 Peter 4:3-5)!

# Conclusion

First Peter 3:15 shows a connection between "sanctifying" deity in our hearts and people asking us about our hope. When the Lord truly has first place in our hearts, we will live differently from the world (cf. Matthew 5:3-10; 2 Peter 1:5-10), and people will want to know why. However, if we are like the world, they will see no difference, and thus have nothing to ask about our hope. Has anyone asked us lately about the hope that is in us?
