## Basics of Prayer

Prayer is one of the major spiritual blessings to the child of God (Eph. 1:3). The word “pray” is mentioned 508 times in the King James Version of the Bible, while the word “prayer” is mentioned 128 times. Not only does prayer have a prominent place in Scripture, but it also should in the lives of God’s people. According to a survey done by Pew Research Center, 55% of Americans say they pray every day, and 45% of Americans said they rely on prayer for decision making (Lipka). Even those who claim to be atheist have been known to pray out of desperation (Boorstein). While it is good that people are thinking about prayer and acknowledging its importance, we need to have a grasp on what the Bible teaches about prayer. If we do not know what the Bible says about prayer, we may fail to do it properly and fail to appreciate its power. A good place to start with any spiritual topic is with the basics (1 Pet. 2:2). Let’s notice some of the basics concerning the spiritual discipline of prayer.

## Directed to God

The first thing to appreciate about prayer is that it is directed to God. While this may seem overly simple, we must appreciate this truth. Prayer is directed to God who is both holy and sovereign. Jesus in the model prayer says God is to be addressed with recognition concerning the holiness of his name (Mt. 6:9). The basic definition of prayer is communication with God. Since prayer is directed to God, this should give us pause and confidence. We should have caution so as not to approach God flippantly but to do so reverently (Psa. 111:9). We live in a day where what is casual is in, and everything holy and serious is out. We must be careful not to carry the careless attitude of our times into the presence of God. God is concerned with how his name is used and we should be concerned with how we use it (Ex. 20:7). We should also take confidence from the fact that we are praying to God. If we were simply praying to humans or some fictitious deity, we would be wasting our time. However, if we are approaching the God who made us in his image and wants to hear from us, we can come into prayer with a boldness and assurance (Heb. 4:16).

## Prerequisites

Before a person could take an advanced Calculus class there would be some basic algebra classes that first need to be taken. These are *(continued on page 2)*

called prerequisites. In prayer, we need to appreciate that there are some prerequisites as well. God is not obligated to hear and answer every prayer that is offered up to him. In fact, he has said he would not. The wicked person needs to know that sin separates him from God and hinders prayers that are offered (Isa. 59:1-2). When a person turns his or her ear from hearing God's law, God turns His ear from hearing his or her prayer (Prov. 28:9). If we want to have our prayers heard by God, we need to be sure that our lives are in harmony with his will. Do not think of this as if we can bribe God with a holy life, but see it as the proper response for God's opening the line of prayer to us in the first place. The eyes of the Lord are in every place, but his ears are only open to the prayers of the righteous (Prov. 15:3; 1 Pet. 3:12). One cannot live a sinful life and expect to have prayers answered by a holy God. When we approach the topic of prayer, it is important to understand that everyone is not in a spiritual condition to pray.

## God's Power

The power of God is something to underscore when considering prayer. If I properly address my prayer to God, live a life acceptable to him, I must then take courage in the fact that God is powerful enough to answer my prayers. While children sometimes ask parents for things that cannot be given due to a lack of resources, God does not have this problem. Paul says God is able to do more than we can ask or even think (Eph. 3:20-21). God is not lacking in anyway the power that is necessary to honor our request. Our faith must be increased to grasp this truth (Mk. 11:22). The God who spoke the world into existence bends his ear to earth so that we can communicate with him. Pray as if God can do something about the circumstances for which we pray. Christians are told to pray without ceasing because there is a God who never ceases to listen. Acknowledge the power of God in prayer and may it encourage us as we pray.

## Answers to Prayer

God hears and answers prayer, though he does not always do so in the way we would sometimes like. Jesus prayed that if there were any other way for redemption to come apart from the cross, let the cup of suffering pass; nevertheless, let God's will be done (Lk. 22:42). God's answer to Jesus' prayer was no. There was no other way to redeem mankind apart from the cross. Yet, God did supply an angel to strengthen Jesus as he went to the cross (Lk. 22:43). Notice that while God declined the request, he supplied what was needed. God does this with us. He does not always supply immediate deliverance from trials when we pray, knowing sometimes trials build strength that we need, but he does supply the strength to endure (1 Cor. 10:13). Also, notice the way Jesus prayed. He left room for the wisdom of His Father, "thy will be done." We need to pray and offer our request but always recognize that God knows best. God knows what we need, and even if he says no, that may be a blessing. God sometimes says yes, sometimes he says no, but he always gets it right. Since God knows everything and we do not, we should pray knowing his answers to our problems are better than ours.

## What to Pray For

Those who do not study the Bible are not ready to pray. Prayers should be Biblical in nature. This does not mean every request must come directly from a passage, but we should outline our prayers based on what we find in Scripture (1 Jn. 5:14). Paul often prayed for open doors to share the gospel (Col. 4:2-3). Paul requested prayers to be delivered from physical trouble (2 Thess. 3:1-2). Occasionally, prayer requests are made for the spiritual growth of others and boldness to speak for God (Eph. 1:16-18, 6:19-20). Are our prayers directed more toward physical or spiritual things? We are physical beings and live in a material world. We have needs that must be met, and we can pray for those things (Mt. 7:7-11). Yet, we should pray for eternal things more than we do the temporal.

As we think about the blessings of prayer, may we grow deeper and more diligent in this endeavor. Realize prayers are to God and a godly life must accompany our petitions. Furthermore, God is strong enough to answer prayer even if it is not the answer we hoped for, and may we examine Scripture for the content of our prayers.

# Pre-Creation P's

Paul said that Deity “chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He has made us accepted in the Beloved” (Eph. 1:4-6). Of all the great “nuggets” in these verses, let us consider the phrase “before the foundation of the world.” God had a plan, a people, and a place already chosen before He created the universe. First, consider the plan of salvation. Paul said that Christians have “hope of eternal life which God, who cannot lie, promised before time began” (Titus 1:2). This plan was not revealed fully in the Old Testament (Matthew 13:35), but was revealed with the coming of Christ in flesh. Jesus “indeed was foreordained before the foundation of the world, but was manifest in these last times for you” (1 Peter 1:20). Jesus, the “Lamb was slain from the foundation of the world” (Revelation 13:8). God had a plan from before the creation of time! Second, before light was created, God already chose a precious people (Ephesians 1:4-6). God did not unconditionally choose people to be saved or lost as per Calvinism, but He chose people based on the system of salvation He predetermined. That is, whoever accepts His plan of salvation will be saved (1 Peter 2:6-8). Yes, God knows exactly who will be lost and who will be saved, but He does *(continued below)*

*(continued from above)* not force people to accept or reject the Gospel. Similarly, Jesus knew Judas would betray Him (John 13:25-20), but that does not mean Jesus made Judas betray Him (James 1:13)! Third, because Deity had already chosen a people before the universe was created, based on a plan that was in God’s mind from eternity, Deity, logically, would have already chosen an eternal place of abode before He spoke the universe into existence. In that great Judgment scene, “the King [Jesus] will say to those on His right hand, Come, you blessed of My Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world” (Matthew 25:34). God wants each of us to be with Him eternally! He has made provisions and continues to encourage us through His word. Won’t you accept His invitation and be saved from sin and be a child of God? ❤️ *Brian*
