In the World but Not of the World

The Lord's prayer found in John 17 occurred a short time before Jesus was betrayed by Judas and His fraudulent "legal proceedings" began. In this prayer, Jesus prayed for Himself (John 17:1-5), for His apostles (John 17:6-19), and for all future disciples, including us (John 17:20-26). Throughout the prayer, Jesus prayed that God would keep, or guard, His apostles (John 17:11, 15) and sanctify them (John 17:17). As part of that desire, Jesus pled with the Father:

I do not pray that You should take them out of the world, but that You should keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth. ¹⁸As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world. ¹⁹And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they also may be sanctified by the truth. (John 17:15-19)

The apostles, though living in the world, were not to be of the world (John 17:11, 14-16), just like Jesus, though living in the world (John 1:10), was not part of the world (John 17:14). While we are not "apostles" in the strictest sense of the word (but we are, generally, "sent with a message," Matthew 28:19-20; Mark 16:15), there are principles in this section of Jesus' prayer that apply to us (2 Timothy 3:16-17).

In the World

There at least three ways the word "world" is used in Scripture. First, the "world" can refer to the created world. God created it to be inhabited (Isa. 45:18). Its boundaries were created very purposefully.

God, who made the world and everything in it ... And He has made from one blood every nation of men to dwell on all the face of the earth, and has determined their

preappointed times and the boundaries of their dwellings, so that they should seek the Lord, in the hope that they might grope for Him and find Him, though He is not far from each one of us. (Acts 17:24-27)

A major purpose for God's design of this world is so we will find Him (cf. Psalm 19:1-6; Romans 1:20; Acts 14:17)! Second, the "world" can refer to people, "For God so loved



the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). The offer of salvation is for all people, especially portrayed by Peter before Cornelius, that "God shows no partiality. But in every nation whoever fears Him and works righteousness is accepted by Him" (Acts 10:34-35 cf. Rom. 1:16; Rev. 22:17). Third, the "world" can refer to the arena of the flesh, or worldliness. John warned:

Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. ¹⁶For all that is in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life—is not of the Father but is of the world. ¹⁷And the world is passing away, and the lust of it; but he who does the will of God abides forever. (1 Jn. 2:15-17)

This kind of worldliness prefers darkness, for "everyone practicing evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed" (Jn. 3:18-21). For this reason, faithful Christians can expect hatred toward them (1 Jn. 3:13). Jesus confirmed:

If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you. ¹⁹If you were of the world, the world would love its own. Yet because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you. ²⁰Remember the word that I said to you, "A servant is not greater than his master." If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you. If they kept My word, they will keep yours also. (John 15:18-20)

No wonder, then, John declared, "Do not marvel, my brethren, if the world hates you" (1 John 3:13)!

Christians have no choice but to live in the "world," so far as it refers to the place God created for humans to dwell. However, we do have a choice as to being controlled by worldly lusts (cf. Galatians 5:16-26). While living in this world, we must exert the influence God desires, as "the salt of the earth … the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill … light … before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven" (Matthew 5:13-16). God never intended His people to live as monks in a monastery! Rather, Christians must influence the world so the lost can be saved (Philippians 2:14-15; 1 Peter 2:12).

Not of the World

As Jesus declared, "I am not of the world" (John 17:14), Christians must not be of the world. Paul clearly stated, "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God" (Rom. 12:1-2). Members of Christ's body must not let the world shape their minds, "conforming yourselves to the former lusts, as in your ignorance" (1 Peter 1:14). Instead, Christians must let God's will shape their minds. When we study God's word and come face-to-face with the "perfect law of liberty" (James 1:25; 2:12), "we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord" (2 Corinthians 3:18)! When Christians are not continually transformed, worldliness will be seen. Paul wrote about the worldliness of the Corinthian church members:

And I, brethren, could not speak to you as to spiritual people but as to carnal, as to babes in Christ. ²I fed you with milk and not with solid food; for until now you were not able to receive it, and even now you are still not able; ³for you are still carnal. For where there are envy, strife, and divisions among you, are you not carnal and behaving like mere men? ⁴For when one says, "I am of Paul," and another, "I am of Apollos," are you not carnal? (1 Corinthians 3:1-4)

Three distinct signs are evident in Christians who are worldly: (1) they are still "babes" in Christ, even though sufficient time has passed where growth should be evident (cf. Hebrews 5:12-13); (2)they are unable to handle "solid food," which refers to growth beyond the basic principles (cf. Hebrews 5:14; James 1:23-25); and (3) they are full of envy, strife, and division over other people (cf. 1 Corinthians 1:10-13).

Conclusion

Faithful Christians are incompatible with worldliness! May we heed the words of Peter, "Therefore, since Christ suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves also with the same mind, for he who has suffered in the flesh has ceased from sin, that he no longer should live the rest of his time in the flesh for the lusts of men, but for the will of God" (1 Peter 4:1-2).


Door Knocking Evangelism Campaign
