Elements in a Faithful Servant's Blessing

In Matthew 24:3, the disciples asked Jesus two questions that involved three parts. "Tell us, when will these things be? And what will be the sign of Your coming, and of the end of the age?" Jesus answered the first part dealing with the destruction of Jerusalem ("these things" cf. Matthew 23:37-39) in Matthew 24:4-35. Jesus answered the third part and what the disciples partially meant in the second part of their question in Matthew 24:36-51. Jesus concluded the direct part of His answer by stating, "Therefore you also be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect" (Matthew 24:44). Then, the Master Teacher said, "Who then is a faithful and wise servant ...? Blessed is that servant whom his master, when he comes, will find so doing" (Matthew 24:45-46). From this context, let us examine three elements involved in a faithful servant's reward.

A Servant Who Is Looking

There are two servants in this context. One is faithful (Matthew 24:45-47), and one is not (Matthew 24:48-51). To be a servant of Jesus is to voluntarily submit to His will (Romans 6:16-18). Initially submitting to His will makes a person a "new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new" (2 Corinthians 5:17). A once faithful servant can cease serving Christ and

become unfaithful (Philemon 24; Colossians 4:14 cf. 2 Timothy 4:10). Jesus pronounced a blessing on the faithful servant (Matthew 24:46a). This servant became ruler of the household in his master's absence. Again, he could either exercise his stewardship well (cf. Mt. 24:45-47) or poorly (cf. Mt. 24:48-51). This steward was "blessed" because the returning lord found him "so doing" (Matthew 24:46). Paul lists a number of qualities a "servant of the Lord" must possess, including being gentile, humble, patient, and the ability to teach (2 Timothy 2:24-26). A faithful servant will live as if the Lord were to return any moment. That is, a faithful servant will stay ready to keep from having to get ready! Paul declared, "For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait [look, KJV] for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ" (Philippians 3:20). The Hebrews writer confirmed, "And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment, so Christ was offered once to bear the sins of many. To those who eagerly wait [look, KJV] for Him He will appear a second time, apart from sin, for salvation" (Heb. 9:27-28).

A Savior Who Is Coming

Jesus said that "the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect" (Matthew 24:44)! The illustration Jesus gave also mentioned the "master, when he comes" (Matthew 24:46). Jesus came the first time to save us from sin. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved" (John 3:16-17). When He comes again, it will be to separate the righteous (those who have done His will) into "eternal life" from the wicked (those who have not done His will) into "the everlasting fire prepared for the devil and his angels ... into everlasting punishment" (Matthew 25:41-46). When Jesus comes, it will be too late to serve Him (cf. Revelation 20:11-15)! We must follow Jesus' example of serving, as He said, "I must work the works of Him who sent Me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work" (John 9:4). Greater reward awaits the servant who faithfully works during the Master's absence (Matthew 24:47 cf. Matthew 25:21, 23, 34-40).

A Standard That Is Abiding

The statement, "will find so doing" (Matthew 24:46c), implies a standard by which the faithful servant could be judged and awarded. Unpreparedness in the unfaithful servant consisted of selfish exploitation of others (Matthew 24:48-49). This unfaithful servant must have thought, "A long time is going to elapse before my master returns. In the mean time, I'm going to do my own thing" (cf. 2 Peter 3:3-4). This servant was characterized by carelessness (says "in his heart," contrasted with "so doing" in the faithful servant); cruelty (begins to beat his fellow servants ... until the Lord comes); and carousing (i.e.,hanging out with drunkards). The Master will come unexpectedly, and this unfaithful servant will share the same fate as the hypocrite because he did not do what his professed position demanded (Matthew 24:50-51 cf. Matthew 23:3-4). The standard by which all servants will be judged and awarded or punished is God's will — not what we think is God's will, but God's true will! Listen to Jesus, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven. Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?' And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!'" (Matthew 7:21-23).

Conclusion

A major point in Jesus' teaching about the end of time is that no one knows when it will come (cf. 1 Thessalonians 5:1-2; 2 Peter 2:9-10). Not even Jesus was authorized to reveal that (cf. Mark 13:32). Interpreting apocalyptic symbols, counting days, or recognizing the "signs of the time" will not result in figuring out when Jesus will come. The best way to be prepared for the end of time is to always be doing the Master's will (Heb. 5:9)! Stay ready to keep from having to get ready! We are prepared only when we are serving the Master in the work He has entrusted to us (cf. Romans 2:10; 1 Corinthians 15:58). "Blessed is that servant whom his master, when he comes, will find so doing" (Matthew 24:46)!

Take a Moment to Make a Moment

Moment is defined as a brief period of time--it can be few seconds, few minutes, an hour or maybe a day. Take a moment to open a door for someone in a wheelchair, smiling or saying hello to someone you don't know, shaking hands with a visitor after worship service, cooking a meal for a neighbor, or maybe spending time comforting someone who is bereaved or facing the trials of life.

In Luke 10:30-37, we read the parable of a man who fell among thieves, who was stripped of his clothing, wounded and left for dead. After a priest and a Levite ignored the needs of the man, along came a Samaritan who took a moment to make a moment. Beginning at verse 33--"But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was. And when he saw him, he had compassion. So, he went to him and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine; and he set him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him."

We find another example of someone taking a moment to make a moment in John 4:28-29 — "The woman then left her water pot, went her way into the city, and said to the men, "Come, see a Man who told me all things that I ever did. Could this be the Christ?"


Step out on faith and take a moment to make a moment in someone's life.

V. Daugherty **Lessons From I Timothy**

Final Instructions from a Father to Son (I Timothy 6:11-16)

What are you pursuing? As young people grow their aims in this life vary. They may explore various interests, seeking out various relationships, and various career opportunities. Wherever life may take you, be sure that there is an overarching aim that all others can fall into alignment with our obedience to Christ. Paul challenged Timothy, "Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life" (v. 12). Be ambitious, be driven, have a clear aim and strive for it with all that you have. There are too many young people in our world who have no idea who they are, where they come from, and least of all where they are going. But you, my son flee from mediocrity and laziness. Paul called his son Timothy a "man of God", and a man of God pursues "righteousness, godliness, faith, love, patience, and gentleness" (v. 11). This aim begins with the top of the pyramid, confessing Jesus as Lord of your life. Keeping Christ in His proper place helps all the other things fall into their proper places. Jesus put it this way, "Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you" (Matt. 6:33).
