## **Basics of Encouragement to Share the Good News**

The great commission was given to the apostles before the Lord ascended to God's right hand (Mt. 28:18-20; Mk. 16:15-16). Since no apostles are living today, does this means that no one has the responsibility of evangelizing the world? Contrary to popular thought, sharing the good news of the gospel is not exclusively the work of preachers, elders, or deacons. It is every Christian's responsibility and opportunity to lead souls to Christ (cf. Mt. 5:16; Acts 8:4). Here are some reminders that are intended to encourage us to share the good news within the sphere of our influence.

**The Need** There is a tremendous need to teach the gospel because all accountable people have sinned and need the blood of Christ to cleanse them spiritually. Sin separates human souls from God (Isa. 59:1-2). The Bible explicitly defines "sin" as "lawlessness," or "transgression of God's law" (1 Jn. 3:4, KJV); as "unrighteousness" (1 Jn. 5:17); as when a person "knows to do good and does not do it" (Jas. 4:17); and as any action "not from faith," which refers to a person's going against personal conviction, or violating the conscience (Rom. 14:23). Given those Bible definitions of sin, it is clear that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rom. 3:23). Obedience to the gospel is sin's only remedy, for the gospel is "the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes" (Rom. 1:16). Faithful Christians cannot ignore the need!

**The Examples** Jesus, of course, is the best example we have of everything, especially when it comes to seeking the lost. He succinctly summarized His mission: "for the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost" (Lk. 19:10). We can also glean important truths from other soul winning examples. Consider what Paul exemplified in First Corinthians 9:19-23, "For though I am free from all men, I have made myself a servant to all, that I might win the more ... I have become all things to all men, that I might by all means save some. Now this I do for the gospel's sake." Like Paul, we must be willing to adapt culturally in order to reach lost souls! Because we have liberty in Christ to do something (like eat meat, 1 Cor. 8:1-9), does not mean we have to exercise that freedom, especially when our refraining from certain liberties can reach more people for Christ (cf. 1 Cor. 8:10-13). Consider also the example of Timothy's character, of whom Paul said, "I have no one like-minded, who will sincerely care for your state. For all seek their own, not the things which are of Christ Jesus. But you know his proven character" (Phil. 2:20-22). When we cultivate the character traits of these biblical examples, we will lead more souls to Jesus (cf. 1 Cor. 11:1).

**The Candidates** There are basically two major categories from which candidates for Bible studies come: people who come to us and people to whom we go. Sometimes, people were sent to Jesus (Jn. 7:32) and sometimes Jesus purposely approached people (Jn. 4:4-7), but either way Jesus would turn the situation into a profitable discussion of spiritual matters (cf. Jn. 4:19-30; 7:33-46). First, people who come to us many times are coming to sell something or to service something of ours. These are often great opportunities to discuss Bible subjects. Often, a salesman's pitch can be turned into an invitation to look into God's word (such as responding to a pitch, "What do families need most?" with "The love of God in their homes [Eph. 5:22-29]"). When people come into our homes, for example, to repair appliances, our friendly, Christlike demeanor can cause them to ask questions like what we do for a living, to which we can interject the important role Jesus and His church has in our lives (cf. Gal. 2:20; Phil. 1:21). Second, when we approach people, such as in door knocking campaigns, we must respect privacy, not be forceful, and, again, show a friendly and Christ-like demeanor that will prompt spiritual discussions (Mt. 22:41-42).

**The Application** There is no substitute for getting out and sharing the good news. There are many good "programs" of personal work, all of which are good and successful ... if we would only put them to practice! Sometimes, lack of sharing the gospel is because of fear, while for others it is a matter of slothfulness. Concerning the former, "God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind" (2 Tim. 1:7). Concerning the latter, Christians are to be "not lagging in diligence," but "fervent in spirit, serving the Lord" (Rom. 12:11). Let us look for and take advantage of opportunities to share the good news!

### <u>It's Me Lord,</u> <u>Standing in the need of Prayer!</u>

Lord—not my husband, not children, not my friends, but me, O Lord.

I stand in need of prayer, and I beg you for your forgiveness. Thoughts come to my mind when the devil sees an opportune moment.

Lord, I must quickly beg for forgiveness because "the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour." (1 Peter 5:8)

Wanting you to be longsuffering towards me, but not always willing to suffer long!

Why do I expect mercy, but find that I am partial in giving mercy?

It's me, O Lord, I stand in need of prayer!

Have mercy on me, O Lord, for I am weak; O Lord, heal me, for my bones are troubled.

(Psalm 6:1)

Have mercy upon me, O God, according to your lovingkindness; according to the multitude of your tender mercies, blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin.

(Psalm 51: 1-3)

For I acknowledge my transgressions, and my sin is always before me.

### Overcoming Temptation

The patriarch Joseph is a great example to all Christians, especially those who are young. One great lesson we learn from his confrontation with Potiphar's wife is how to overcome temptation (Gen. 39:7-21). Note four musts in overcoming temptation:

- 1. Recognize sin for what it is (Gen. 39:7-9). Joseph did not want to disappoint Potiphar and break his trust. Joseph did not want to take another man's wife. Most of all, Joseph did not want to sin against God. He knew it would separate him (Isa. 59:1-2)!
- 2. Be willing to take drastic measures to keep from sinning (Gen. 39:10-12). When Potiphar's wife (seemingly) arranged an empty room to grab hold of Joseph, he ran out to the street. We must do all within our power to avoid sin (Matt. 5:29-30).
- 3. Be willing to suffer persecution for righteousness' sake (Gen. 39:13-20). Potiphar's wife lied to the men and to her husband about what happened. As a result, Joseph was put in prison. We must not let persecution keep us from doing what is right (1 Pet. 4:16).
- 4. Remember that God is with His people. An oft repeated phrase in the patriarch's life is "the LORD was with Joseph" (Gen. 39:2, 3, 21, 23). God has promised, "'I will never leave you nor forsake you." So we may boldly say: 'The LORD is my helper; I will not fear. What can man do to me?'" (Heb. 13:5-6).

May we never be faced with the kind of temptation Potiphar's wife brought to Joseph, but if we face that temptation or any other, we are armed and need not yield to sin! God provides the escape if we seek it with the above points (1 Cor. 10:13)! \\mathbb{Brian}
