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God's Greenhouse

"A greenhouse is a structure which allows people to regulate climatic conditions, such as temperature and humidity" (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/ Greenhouse). Its purpose is to maximize the growth of plants by effectively utilizing the light and warmth of the sun, especially in climates where growth would be difficult or impossible. The greenhouse is typically an enclosed structure primarily comprised of glass (or plexiglass) and must be maintained to be effective. Primitive concepts of the greenhouse can be traced back to the first century Roman world:

The cucumber was a favorite of Roman emperor Tiberius, who "was never without it" (Pliny the Elder 77 CE in Bostock and Riley 1855). The Roman gardeners used artificial methods (similar to the greenhouse system) of growing to have it available for his table every day of the year. Cucumbers were planted in wheeled carts, which were put in the sun daily, then taken inside to keep them warm at night under special conditions (Pliny the Elder 77 CE). The cucumbers were stored under frames or in cucumber houses glazed with either oiled cloth, known as "specularia," or with sheets of mica. (https://www.newworldencyclopedia.org/entry/Greenhouse)

History also notes that even George Washington had a greenhouse built to grow pineapples. (https://www.gardenguides.com/85466-history-greenhouse.html)

From cucumbers to pineapples, people across the centuries have employed greenhouses to cultivate healthy plant growth despite adverse climate conditions. Experience and history prove that when plants get the sunlight, warmth, and water they need, growth is inevitable regardless of what lies beyond the greenhouse glass. Where there is a will, there is a way—God's church is not too different.

Every Christian is a result of the gospel seed that has taken root within the fertile soil of a good heart (cf. Mt. 13:3-23). Whenever we "lay aside all filthiness and overflow of wickedness, and receive with meekness the implanted word," the result is salvation (Jas. 1:21, NKJV). God's grace coupled with our faith drives us to do good works and continue in them (Eph. 2:8-10). Collectively, even though we are individuals, we are all members of the same body (Rom. 12:5) called the church (Eph. 1:22-23). This "household of God" is designed to be a place where God dwells (Eph. 2:19-22) and where, "according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love" (Eph. 4:16). In a similar sense, the church is (or should be) God's greenhouse for Christians.

Godis Greenhouse is Filled with Godis Light

"God is light and in Him is no darkness at all" (1 Jn. 1:7). "But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light" (2 Pet. 1:19). "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light" (Eph. 5:8). God's church must be a place filled and defined by God's light. If each Christian represented a glass pane in this greenhouse, how much of God's light shines through you? A greenhouse is not designed to allow light through only a few select panes, but every pane provides a clear path. When others see our congregation (or homes), they should see God's light permeating through every nook and cranny of our lives. From our public interactions with one another to our private conversations, our light must shine (Mt. 5:14-16). Even when there are visible "cracks" (i.e., flaws, faults, and failures), God's light (i.e., grace, mercy, and love) still shimmers as we delicately mend and repair. As God's people, "let us cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light" (Rom. 13:12)—there is no such thing as a dark corner in a house of light.

God's Greenhouse Produces The Ideal Conditions

"And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love to one another and to all, just as we do to you" (1 Thess. 3:12). "And this I pray, that your love may abound still more and more in knowledge and all discernment" (Phil. 1:9). God's church should provide an ideal, Christ-like atmosphere contrary to the world. "And do not be confirmed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind" (Rom. 12:2). Greenhouses are built because the existing conditions fail to promote or sustain healthy growth. Congregational assemblies (worship or otherwise) should be the kind of meetings that, by the end, you leave uplifted, fed, and recharged. The church proves these ideal conditions when: edifying loves prevails against arrogant knowledge (1 Cor. 8:1); exemplifying Christ's love replaces exercising our rights (1 Cor. 8:9); self-induced servanthood masters indulgent self-serving (1 Cor. 9:19-23); and seeking God's glory eclipses seeking our own (1 Cor. 10:31-33).

God's Greenhouse Is A Place of Warmth

"Since you have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit in sincere love of the brethren, love one another fervently with a pure heart" (1 Pet. 1:22). "Be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to one another" (Rom. 12:10). God's church should be the most inviting and welcoming entity in existence. Yet, why is it that so many churches portray the opposite? Jesus stood in stark contrast to the cold, calculating religious leaders of His day. While they would "justify" their icy demeanors in dismissing certain types/groups of people, Jesus welcomed all equally. Every invitation Jesus extended stemmed from a heart of love and compassion. A greenhouse emits warmth so that plants will grow and flourish; a refrigerator maintains a cold temperature to preserve foods. The former focuses on the development and maturity of plants, while the later focuses on keeping food edible as long as possible. May our lives and church be a greenhouse filled with warmth cultivating good trees with good fruit (Mt. 7: 17), not a refrigerator maintaining a chilly atmosphere slowing the inevitable decay of every item in it.

Conducion

God's greenhouse, the church, was built by the sacrifice and blood of Jesus (Acts. 20:28). Just as He gave all to provide us a safe and secure place for growth in godliness, we must reciprocate in our devotion to him. "Therefore be imitators of God as dear children. And walk in love, as Christ also has loved us and

given Himself for us, an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweet-smelling aroma" (Eph. 5:1-2). The church is designed to be a climate for growth and salvation, but it is also a place with expectations. As Paul reminded Timothy, "I write so that you may know how you ought to conduct yourself in the house of God" (1 Tim. 3:15). When we are "speaking the truth in love," we "grow up in all things into Him who is the head—Christ" (Eph. 4:15). This is brought about when "the whole body, joined and knit together by what every joint supplies, according to the effective working by which every part does its share, causes growth of the body for the edifying of itself in love" (Eph. 4:15-16). "And this commandment we have from Him: that he who loves God must love his brother also" (1 Jn. 4:21).

Don't Be A House Not Divided!

Jesus declared a "house divided against itself will not stand" (Mt. 12:25). This world is full of division, and Satan loves to employ it in his schemes (2 Cor. 2:11; 10:3-5)! He would love nothing more than to divide local churches by whatever means it takes. Let us not allow the devil this opportunity (Eph. 4:27), but rather resist him through the Christ (Jas. 4:7)!


