# Preaching: A View from the Pew

Last month in Germany over three hundred people took time out of their Friday evening to attend the first ever A. I. (artificial intelligence) generated church service. The 40-minute message was delivered through ChatGPT, which also produced a personified avatar of a man's profile to offer a more personal feel. It feels weird to live in our time when I consider: should I be worried about A. I. coming for my job as a preacher? Maybe we ought to take a moment and think critically about the question of what does preaching entail? Can anyone (or any robot) with the gift of gab and a microphone stand in the pulpit? What ought people sitting in the pew to expect when they listen to a sermon? What is God's purpose and design for preachers? This is especially true for the congregation at SFA. What ought we look for in the individuals who stand in the pulpit

# Preaching Defined

Preaching is the proclamation of God's word. God, however, did not miraculously drop tape recorders from heaven for us to hear His message. Preaching involves human agency. It is God's message delivered through human personality. The preacher is one who gathers attention to the message God desires to deliver. In Greek, the term is *kérussó* (κηρύσσω). The term means to proclaim, herald, or preach. In the Greek and Roman world, meetings could be called for civic purposes and a runner would announce to the people of the city to gather. God's messenger and message are taken from the same root word. Another term we ought to be familiar with is *euaggelizó* (εὐαγγελίζω). The term means to announce the good news. In our Bibles, it is often translated "preach the gospel." Notice both words are used in Romans 10:15, "And how shall they preach [from kérussó] unless they are sent? As it is written, 'How beautiful are the feet of those who proclaim [from euaggelizó] peace, who bring the gospel [or good news, from euaggelizó] of good things!" Paul was fired-up to come to Rome to preach the gospel, for he knew in it, the gospel, was the power of God to offer salvation to both Jews and Greeks (Rom. 1:15-17).

Why is preaching so important? Jesus was God's Son, He was a preacher, and He said, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you fre" (John 8:31, 32). He also said, "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth" (John 17:17). In a world that would settle for attempting to invent truth, God is *The Truth* (John 14:6). In our world people will call things that are less than true, true and hope that nobody will notice. It is noticeable when the obvious reality does not match their definitions. We as God-fearers must have a hunger and thirst for God's word. It is the only hope we can have of properly navigating through this life and the next. First Peter 3:15 states, "But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts, and always be ready to give a defense to everyone who asks you a reason for the hope that is within

you with meekness and fear." If God's word is life-giving truth that one must use as a defense of their mode of being, what is it that we ought to expect from the individual who stands in the pulpit?

# Expectations from the Pew

- 1. Give Me Christ Exacted! Jesus told Nicodemus; the Son of Man must be lifted up (John 3:13). Again, He said in John 12:32, "I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all peoples to Myself." Primarily, the preacher ought to glorify Jesus Christ. Further, he must glory in the cross of Christ. The gospel message may seem strange in the beginning, but it must be taught over and over. Without God coming in the flesh (John 1:1-14), living a perfect sinless life (I Cor. 5:21), and giving His life as a ransom for many (Mark 10:45), we could not have an eternal hope in heaven with Him (I Pet. 1:3). So, when Paul came to a place to evangelize, he said, "And I, brethren, when I came to you, did not come with excellence of speech or of wisdom declaring to you the testimony of God. For I determined not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified" (I Cor. 2:1, 2). Jesus is not just some moral teacher, one among other prophets, He was the promised Messiah, the suffering Servant, the ascended King of Kings and Lord of Lords.
- 2. Give Me God's Word! Preaching is not just having the ability to stand and speak in front of a crowd for 30 minutes. Preaching is not a stand-up comedic routine. Preaching is not story time. Preaching is not entertainment. It is the glorification of God and His word. "If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God. If anyone ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies, that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belong the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen" (I Pet. 4:11). Peter is saying the preacher is just a conduit, or a mouthpiece, of God. Sure, it is good when a preacher is dynamic and lets his personality shine, but he is not to be the one glorified. God alone is! One preacher said good preaching ought to comfort the disturbed and disturb the comfortable. Good preaching must challenge sin in people's lives that have become too comfortable. Good preaching helps individuals to recall those Biblical examples who endured hardship and overcame through faith. The presentation of God's word must also be balanced. Paul said to the Ephesian elders, "I have not shunned to declare to you the whole counsel of God" (Acts 20:27). A preacher must not ride a hobby horse that sounds more like political propaganda. God's word must be balanced between milk and meat for young and mature (I Pet. 2:2; Heb. 5:12-14). Preaching must balance deep theological truths and practical everyday help. Not everyone can stand in the pulpit. Some are very zealous to be leaders, teachers, and preachers but lack the proper knowledge to lead (I Tim. 1:7). Also, some would seek to try to impress with fancy words and scholarly jargon. Brian often describes a sweet spot that is where both the mature and the calves can get it.
- 3. Give Me explanation! When the walls were rebuilt in Nehemiah's day, they asked the scribe Ezra to read from the law in the open square (Neh. 8). Ezra, "stood on a platform of wood" (v. 4) specially made for the occasion and had assistants helping him teach the people. "They read distinctly from the book, in the Law of God; and they gave them the sense and helped them to understand the reading" (v. 8). James taught from his letter to not only be hearers of the word but doers as well (James 1:22-27). Preaching is more than academic. It should have a "so what" element to the lesson. How does this apply to my life? How is it to be embodied in the present world? How should my thoughts, feelings, and/or actions change because of this truth that is received? Too, God's word must be explained because it cannot devolve into religious dogmatism. One is being dogmatic when he demands some form of obedience without question. We are to reason from Scripture (Isa. 1:18), not proof text. Sometimes when folks are dogmatic, they can be correct in the truth, yet they cannot explain why. Sometimes a preacher is wrong because his dogmatic preaching/teaching does not align with truth in the natural world or God's word. We must study to show ourselves approved (II Tim. 2:15) but also be humble enough to say when we do not know something. To take a stance on something that has not been fully revealed or fully studied sets one up for failure when he becomes dogmatic.

# Conclusion

Preaching is a cooperative effort. It should originate from the mind of God; it should flow through the pulpit; and come to rest in the hearts and minds of those who sit in the pew to be taken in, understood, and applied to our lives. Then, we are to preach that to the watching world. The glory of preaching is a great and high calling. Those in the pew ought to demand that God's spokesman do what God has called him to do.
