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WHAT ABOUT "ANTICHRIST"?

When studying the Book of Revelation, it is amazing how many commentators refer to the beast (who takes orders from the dragon) as "The Antichrist." It might surprise some to know that the term "antichrist" does not even appear in the Book of Revelation! While it is true that all God's enemies have some things in common (i.e., pride, rebellion, etc.), similarity does not mean sameness (Isa. 14:12-14 cf. II Thes. 2:3-4)! We must allow the Bible to define its terms. In this article, we will examine the term "antichrist" and how it is used in the Bible.

UNDERSTANDING GNOSTICISM

The Epistles of John were written under the backdrop of "incipient [initial stage of] Gnosticism." (This section explaining Gnosticism is adapted from Cairns 96-98.) Gnosticism was the greatest philosophical threat to early Christianity, reaching its peak of power around AD 150. "Incipient" Gnosticism seems to be addressed in the New Testament (cf. Col. 2:8-9, 18-23; 1 Jn. 1:1-3). Tradition attributes the origin of Gnosticism to Simon Magus, whom it is said that Peter had to rebuke severely.

Gnosticism sprang up from an attempt to explain the origin of evil. Gnostics assumed that all physical matter was associated with evil. They sought a way to create a philosophical system in which God as total Spirit could be freed from association with evil and in which man could be related on the spiritual side of his nature to Deity. They sought to answer great questions surrounding man's origin by synthesizing Christianity and Greek philosophy. Dualism was one of their main tenets. They insisted upon a clear separation of the material world and the spiritual world (because, in their mind, matter was always evil). God, therefore, could not have been Creator of this material world.

"Docetism" is the doctrine they developed to explain Christ. Because all matter was to be associated with evil, Christ as absolute spirit could not be associated with a human body. Either the man Jesus was a phantom with the seeming appearance of a material body (Docetism), or Christ came upon the human body of Jesus only for a short time. They claimed the Christ-spirit came upon the body of Jesus at His baptism, and the Christ-spirit departed from the body of Jesus on the cross. It was the task of Christ to teach a special "gnosis" (knowledge) that would help man to save himself by an intellectual process.

Salvation, which was only for the spiritual part of humans, required special "gnosis," which Christ only imparted to the elite. Since the body was material and destined to be cast off, it might be kept under by strict ascetic practices or be given over to "libertinism" (complete freedom to do anything one desires). There is no place for the bodily resurrection according to Gnosticism. The Lord's Supper was not observed because it involved fruit of the vine and bread, which were considered evil because they were material. A casual reading of Irenaeus'

Against Heresies will reveal that there were many groups of Gnosticism and that their doctrines varied. Marcion and his followers seem to have been the most influential group of Gnostics.

Gnosticism is a damnable doctrine because of its implications. First, it places two gods in complete opposition to one another: the evil "god" of the Old Testament to create the material world, and the good "god" of the New Testament to redeem. Second, it rejects Christ's humanity, sacrificial death, and bodily resurrection. John's writings refute much of incipient Gnosticism. So also does Paul's letter to the Colossians (Col. 1:19; 2:9). Third, it promotes spiritual pride by its doctrine that only an aristocratic elite can be blessed eternally because only they are privileged to receive the special knowledge necessary. Fourth, it has no place for the human body (which will be changed, I Cor. 15:51-56) in the future life. Fifth, its asceticism was a contributing factor to the medieval ascetic movement known as monasticism (cf. Col. 2:20-23).

ANTICHRIST

The word "antichrist" (from antichristos, ἀντίχριστος) occurs only five times in four Bible verses:

Little children, it is the last time: and as ye have heard that antichrist shall come, even now are there many antichrists; whereby we know that it is the last time. (1 John 2:18)

Who is a liar but he that denieth that Jesus is the Christ? He is antichrist, that denieth the Father and the Son. (1 John 2:22)

And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world. (1 John 4:3)

For many deceivers are entered into the world, who confess not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist. (2 John 7)

When these passages are considered, the following emerges: (1) Antichrist was characteristic of the "last time" (1 John 2:18a), which does not necessarily refer to the end of time, immediately prior to the final judgment day (cf. 1 Tim. 4:1-6). (2) Antichrist was one of many other "antichrists" (1 John 2:18b). The idea of "The Antichrist" is foreign to Scripture! The King James Version does not even use the word "the" in describing an antichrist! (3) Antichrist was a liar, one who denied the Father and the Son (1 John 2:22). In that sense, an antichrist was of the devil (cf. John 8:44). This characteristic is more meaningful given the context of incipient Gnosticism. (4) Antichrist was one who would not acknowledge that Jesus had come in the flesh (1 John 4:3a). (5) Antichrist was already in the world when John wrote (1 John 4:3b). (6) Antichrist was a deceiver who does not confesses that Jesus had come in the flesh (2 John 7).

CONCLUSION

This simple Biblical description is quite different from far-fetched denominational descriptions (such as Hindson 1291). They usually equate this "antichrist" with one, or more, or all of the following: (1) the

"abomination of desolation" (Mt. 24:15 cf. Dan. 9:27; 12:11); (2) the "man of sin," or the "wicked one" (2 Thes. 2:3, 8); or (3) the "beast" (Rev. 13:1). Their assumptions are unfounded and also involve many other accompanying errors.

Vessel for Use of the Master (II Tim. 2:20,21)
