To Be "In Christ" Requires Obeying the Gospel

Receiving the spiritual blessings of the truly abundant life necessitates that one be "in Christ" (Eph. 1:3), who is the only "door" through which these blessings can be received (Jn. 10:7-10). Obedience to the Gospel is the only way a person can begin, continue, and eternally enjoy the abundant life. God's plan of salvation concerns two categories of accountable people: those who are outside of Christ (Rom. 3:23), and those who are in Christ, yet still sin (1 Jn. 1:8-10). This article will consider the former.

Hearing God's Word — Those accountable souls who are outside of Christ must first hear the word of God. Paul confirmed that "faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Rom. 10:17). There is no other source of information we need besides the Bible to know what we must do to be pleasing to God (2 Tim. 3:16-17; 2 Pet. 1:3). However, hearing the word of God alone will not save us. There were many who heard God's word on the Day of Pentecost (Acts 2:14-40), but only about three thousand souls repented and were baptized as God commanded (Acts 2:38 cf. Acts 2:41). Hearing God's word without doing what it teaches will not save nor allow us the abundant life (Mt. 13:13-15; Lk. 6:46-49)!

Faith in Jesus Christ — Hearing God's word must lead to faith. Again, Romans 10:17 teaches that true faith cannot come before nor "outrun" our knowledge of God. Biblical faith is not a blind leap in the dark! Furthermore, the Hebrews writer said that "without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him" (Heb. 11:6). One of the necessary things in which a sinner outside of Christ must have faith is that Jesus is the Messiah. He Himself said that "you will die in your sins; for if you do not believe that I am He, you will die in your sins" (Jn. 8:24). However, belief alone will not save. "Even the demons believe—and tremble!" (Jas. 2:19). John wrote, "Nevertheless even among the rulers many believed in Him, but because of the Pharisees they did not confess Him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue; for they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God" (Jn. 12:42-43).

Repenting of Sin — Faith must lead the sinner outside of Christ to repent of his or her sins. The basic meaning of repent is to turn. Thus, repenting from sin means turning away from sin and turning to God for Him to take care of it (cf. Acts 8:22). True repentance comes as a result of being confronted with the nature and consequences of sin (2 Cor. 7:7-8 cf. Isa. 59:1-2), and then having "godly sorrow" for that sin (2 Cor. 7:9-10). Seeing sin as God sees sin is the only way "godly sorrow" can be produced. God hates sin (Pr. 6:16-19), and so should we (Ps. 119:104; Pr. 8:13), especially in our own lives! Seeing sin as God sees it,

should melt our hearts to beg Him for forgiveness (cf. Ps. 51:1-3, 14-19). True repentance results in the reformation of life—change for good that is evident to all (2 Cor. 7:11). However, repentance is more than just regret. Judas was "remorseful and brought back the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders" (Mt. 27:3), yet he did not turn all the way back to God. Instead, "Judas by transgression fell, that he might go to his own place" (Acts 1:25). The terms "repentance" and "remorse," or "regret," are similar in that they each involve a change of mind. For example, both Peter (in denying the Lord three times) and Judas had a change in mind over what they did, but only Peter turned all they way to God in repentance (cf. the incident in Jn. 21:15-17). Thus, repentance not only involves a change of mind, but it also involves a change of action that seeks God's forgiveness!

Confess Faith in Jesus Christ — Repentance must lead the sinner outside of Christ to confess his or her faith in Christ. Others will not know one's belief in Christ and willingness to turn from sins and serve Him unless that person confesses that belief in Him. Paul wrote, "For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation" (Rom. 10:10). As seen earlier, confession of Christ is necessary in letting others know of an individual's decision to follow Him (Jn. 12:42-43). Furthermore, confessing faith in Christ implies that the one so confessing has repented of sins. Paul wrote, "Nevertheless the solid foundation of God stands, having this seal: The Lord knows those who are His, and, Let everyone who names the name of Christ depart from iniquity" (2 Tim. 2:19). However, confessing that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, alone will not give one that abundant life. Demons verbally acknowledged, "Jesus, Son of the Most High God" (Lk. 8:28), but certainly are not saved!

Being Baptized into Jesus Christ — Confessing faith in Christ must lead the sinner outside of Christ to "be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins" (Acts 2:38). Note the account of the eunuch from Ethiopia, who requested Philip to explain the one about whom the prophet Isaiah wrote (Acts 8:30-34 cf. Isa. 53:7-8). Philip, "beginning at this Scripture, preached Jesus to him" (Acts 8:35). We know that Philip's preaching included baptism because:

[A]s they went down the road, they came to some water. And the eunuch said, "See, here is water. What hinders me from being baptized?" Then Philip said, "If you believe with all your heart, you may." And he answered and said, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God." So he commanded the chariot to stand still. And both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water, and he baptized him. (Acts 8:36-38)

Note how hearing, believing, repenting, and confessing faith in Christ were all involved in the eunuch's baptism. Though each term may not have been explicitly stated, we know from the total teaching of the Bible that each was involved.

Baptism alone, of course, will not save a person outside of Christ nor give him or her that abundant life. Because one is immersed in water, thinking that he or she is saved, does not mean that person is truly saved or "in Christ" (cf. Acts 19:1-5). Biblical baptism must be preceded by hearing God's word, believing that Jesus is the Christ, repenting of sin, and confessing faith in Christ. Not only are these the steps involved leading up to baptism, but each step must also be in the order given above or it cannot be true baptism, true confession, true repentance, or true belief.

Conclusion

When the sinner outside of Christ is baptized into Christ, "he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new" (2 Cor. 5:17). However, baptism is not the end of conversion. It

is actually the beginning, the "new birth" (cf. Jn. 3:3, 5; 1 Pet. 1:22-23). When Paul said "all things have become new" (2 Cor. 5:17), he followed up by saying, "Now all things are of God" (2 Cor. 5:18). That is, when a person is baptized "into Christ," he or she must "walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:4), following God's word, even if it results in his or her death (Mt. 16:24-25; Rev. 2:10). When the person in Christ sins (1 Jn. 1:8, 10), he or she must repent and ask God's forgiveness in order to remain saved (Acts 8:18-24; 1 Jn. 1:9), and continue being a recipient of the blessings involved in the abundant life!

Are Our Blessings Really Blessings?

On my recent trip to Peru I believe we were ministered to by the people there as much or more than we ministered to them. One of the things that stands out in my mind is the attitude and receptiveness to the gospel that these people had when it appeared they were living in conditions that we would consider less than ideal according to our standards. They reminded me of the brethren that Paul describes in II Corinthians 8 "that in their deep poverty abounded in the riches of their liberality." So I asked myself this question " are the things we living in America consider to be blessings, really blessings?" or could it be they are actually a curse. We spend a good deal of our time and energy accumulating things that collect dust and that consume our time but are these things what are really important? (Matt. 6:19-21) The people in PERU would stop whatever they were doing and give their full attention to study the Bible (Luke 11:28), they made time to listen. They may not have had a chair to sit on but they weren't embarrassed to welcome us into their home or to sit on the sidewalk and study the Bible. What about you (and me), do we have time to study the Bible and do we have time to share it with others or are we too busy dusting our "stuff" and running here and there to accumulate more? Are we embarrassed by the roof over our heads because it's not as nice as our neighbors, or are we thankful for whatever space we call home and are we willing to open it up to be hospitable to others even if there is dust on the coffee table. Let's make sure we use what God has given us to glorify Him (Matt. 5:16) and not allow our "things" to be a curse rather than a blessing.
