Have You Been to Berea?

Recently, my father was asked by a new convert about how to better study the Scriptures. We often bring individuals to Second Timothy 3:16, 17, showing the Bible is inspired by God and equips us, but rarely how to use the equipment. The new convert said, "I got the equipment and I trust in the equipment, but how do I learn how to use the equipment properly?" My dad took her question and developed the lesson, "Have you been to Berea?" The lesson was great and practical for giving any Bible student principles by which we can better study the Bible.

An Ancient Example (Acts 17:10-12)

First, consider the example of the Bereans. They had a proper attitude towards God's word. Luke said they were "fair-minded" (NKJV). Really what is meant by the term is noble-minded or high minded. They were not noble because of their birth but in how they received the word, "with all readiness." They had a mind that was open to what was being presented to them. Not everyone has an open mind or a proper attitude to even begin a study of God's word. The Bereans took the right action towards God's word. It says they, "searched the Scriptures daily." When something was presented to them, they did not take another man's word for it, but they went to their own Bible's to see what Scripture had to say on the matter. They also searched for the *accuracy* of the message presented. The text says the reason they searched the Scriptures daily was to "find out whether these things were so." Anyone can say anything on a given topic, but that does not make them right. The Bereans compared what they were being taught with what was already established from God's word. Truth seekers are concerned with accuracy; with what corresponds with reality. Sometimes the things that are said or taught do not align with reality. They are not true, but it is only known through one's investigation or study of the accuracy of what is presented. Finally, the Bereans achieved in their study of God's word. As a result of their proper attitude and action towards Scripture, and their scrutiny over the things they were being presented, Luke records, "Therefore many of them believed." This is the example for us to follow in our approach to studying the Scriptures.

Minding Your P's While Studying Scripture

1. <u>Priority.</u> Make the study of Scripture a top priority in your life. Things that are most important are things that are not overlooked. If we are overlooking study, it may reveal studying is not such a top priority. Matthew 6:33 says one must seek first the kingdom of God.

2. <u>Personal.</u> Make the study of Scripture personal, not merely relying on the study of a spouse, a parent, a preacher, etc. Our own study, correct interpretation, and application must be a top priority. Even though there were specific audiences to whom the books of the Bible were addressed, God has perfectly preserved His word for us as well. Make it personal to the point of asking the question, "What does God want me to know from my study?"

3. <u>Pray.</u> At the beginning of each study session, pray. Ask God to help you to focus, to understand, and to be obedient to His word.

4. <u>Purposeful.</u> God's word can give us purpose and meaning to life if we will allow it. Jesus said, "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God" (Matt. 4:4). We are more than just physical beings.

5. <u>Practical.</u> Read God's word for the practical help it can give for daily life. While we are far removed culturally from those in Bible times, human nature has not changed; sin has not changed; and God's plans for us have not changed.

6. <u>Practice.</u> James 1:21-27 says that if we receive the word with meekness, it is able to save our soul, but He also writes, "be doers of the word, and not hearers only." The law of Christ is liberating if we "continue in it."

7. <u>Ponder.</u> The Psalms tell the Bible student to "meditate" on God's word (Ps. 1:2; 119:15; and Phil. 4:8). The practice is to let the word of God wash over us, repeat the phrases, think about them, memorize them. Like a cow who chews on the cud, let those words ruminate in our minds to better understand and better apply.

8. <u>Private</u>. Find a place that is quiet and free from distractions. Jesus told His disciples to go in their room and shut the door when they pray (Matt. 6:6). It is true too for study.

9. <u>Patient</u>. One illustration says, you cannot scoop out the ocean with a teaspoon. Neither can you know everything in one study. Individuals put in years of effort and energy. Be disciplined in our approach to study. Carve out a specific time and purpose for what and why we are studying. Over time our knowledge will grow; be patient; be persistent.

10. <u>Precious.</u> Second Peter 1:4 tells of the precious promises we have in Christ. We can know about them through the study and knowledge of God's word. We invest in things that are precious

to us. Look at God's word as something that is more precious than gold or silver.

11. <u>Pleasurable.</u> The Psalmist said his delight was in the law of the Lord (Ps. 1:2). Things that we enjoy, we find time to spend doing it more. Again, the Psalmist says, "Your Law is my delight" (Ps. 119:92). Further, he says, "How sweet are Your words to my taste, Sweeter than honey to my mouth!" (Ps. 119:103). "O taste and see that the Lord is good" (Ps. 34:8). God says of a study of Him through His word, "Try it, you'll like it!"
