MISSION FIELDS

Government Overreach

In this past Sunday Bible class, guest speaker Joe Wells mentioned three God-ordained institutions: the home, the church, and government. Joe's lesson focused more on the home and the church, and how they have different domains of responsibility. He mentioned how all three institutions have a particular jurisdiction. Jurisdiction is defined as, the power to make decisions or the extent of authority to make decisions. While a husband and a father has the God-given authority to be the head of his home and make decisions, there is a domain beyond his authority. That head of the home does not have the authority to march up to the president of the United States and demand we invade a foreign country. He does not have the right to march into an elders meeting at his local church and demand access to the church treasury to do as he sees fit. Those scenarios are absurd because a father and husband does not have jurisdiction to make decisions for the government or the church.

While Joe's lesson focused on the church and the home working in their proper domains, I want to focus on the proper domain of the government. We live in turbulent times. The current climate of government is one of overreach, in our country and many others the world over. Government is a God-ordained institution (Rom. 13), but its power and authority is been delegated by the One with all power and authority (Matt. 28:19). When government goes beyond its intended jurisdiction it disrupts the other institutions like the home and the church.

#1 Arbiter of truth

In the past few months, our country's government Department of Homeland Security launched a "Disinformation Governance Board" to combat misinformation. From its inception, it was ridiculed and mocked for its blatant bias and hubris. When a government agency positions itself as the arbiter of truth, it would have to claim it was all-knowing. Further what would become of the agency if something was labeled as "misinformation" but later it was found out that, that something was in fact true information? Truth cannot be arbitrarily doled out by any one man (or a government agency). That is why I am thankful we have a right to the freedom of speech, which in turn means freedom of thought. What if a government agency labeled the Bible as "misinformation" and censored anyone who used it for their standard of truth? When the Truth was standing before Pilate, he thought he could arbitrarily decide on matters of truth. Jesus said it is only by knowing the truth can one be free (John 8:31). Government, subject to human errors ought to seek truth, but it cannot be the arbiters of truth, that domain belongs to God. "Sanctify them by Your truth, Your word is truth" (John 17:17).

#2 Corruption of Marriage

The oldest institution of the three is the home. The first part of creation that God determined was not good was that man was alone. So God created woman as a helper. Together they were perfect for each other. And, "There God has joined together, let not man separate" (Matt. 19:6). Government, the church, and the home can work in harmony on the issue of marriage, but it cannot overrule in places beyond its authority. Jesus's conclusion on marriage is that it ought to be one man and one woman for life. The government has

allowed for easy or "no-fault" divorce to devastate the home. A recent Pew research study concluded that the United States has the highest rate of single-parent homes in the world. Further, the government has decided that it can be the de facto husband through government programs has decided that it can be the de facto husband through government programs and incentives. Government programs incentivize fathers and husbands to abdicate their God-given role, and wives and mothers to be less careful about their partners. When God saw that it was not good for man to be alone, He created woman. Man and woman compliment each other. Within the last few years, the government has decided it can make fundamental changes to the definition of marriage to include homosexual relationships as well. This is just as absurd for me to try to call the president of the United States and tell him to invade a foreign country. Marriage is defined by God. So for government to rule in cases such as same-sex marriage goes beyond its defined jurisdiction.

#3 Sexual Education

As an arm of the government, public schools have left their domain and teach on topics of sexuality. It used to be that the school's responsibility was to teach reading, writing, and arithmetic, but it seems there are major changes in schools' curricula. Children in some instances have been assigned sexually explicit and perverse readings that even school board members will not allow to be read at meetings. Teachers who feel the need to teach children about alternative pronouns. There have been instances of field trips to drag queen shows. Counselors who affirm transgenderism to students will help to hide or encourage students to hide their transitions to parents. Some states have attempted to put laws in place to prevent the sexualization of students at younger ages. Some brave parents have stood up against the sexualization of their kids. Jesus said of those who would corrupt young people, "it would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck, and he were drowned in the depth of the sea" (Matt. 18:6).

Conclusion

When we see these clear instances of government leaving their proper domain and jurisdiction we must stand up for what is right. Prophets in the old testament were sent to rebuke kings, John the Baptist and Jesus were outspoken against government corruption. If God ordained government, it also has a proper function. One perspective we may need to consider is that when the government overreaches its proper domain is that it is exposing a deficiency in the domain it is encroaching upon. As Christians must do a better job of defending truth, marriage, and the home. When we fail to properly uphold truth, marriage, and the home, we seed the ground to other institutions. Christians must be the city on a hill that others can look to. Christians must set the standard and example by which marriages reflect Christ's love for the church. Christians must be the ones seeking truth. Christians must be the ones protecting and disciplining children to bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.
