

***** THE DAYS OF EZEKIEL ***

In the days of Ezekiel, God's promises to Israel and David seem like a shadow of a very distant memory. Apostasy and idolatry had eroded Judah's foundation. She saw her neighbor to the north taken away by the Assyrians into captivity. Instead of learning from their failures, they abandoned God to side with nations like Egypt and Tyre. Now they faced their own imminent destruction at the hands of Nebuchadnezzar and the Babylonians. Ezekiel was among some of the earlier captives taken to Babylon and was called to be God's prophet on his thirtieth birthday. Ezekiel's burden of being a man of God was no small task. He was directed by God to level the charges against the nation of Judah. They were guilty and their punishment would be severe. Though the city of Jerusalem would be besieged and its people would be taken into captivity for 70 years, that would not be their final chapter. Even in terrible circumstances, God can breathe new life into things we thought were dead and gone.

DEM BONES

In Ezekiel 37 God showed His prophet a vision. He brought him to a valley that was "full of bones... and indeed they were very dry" (v. 1,2). What a terrifying nightmare for Ezekiel to behold. The bones were an allegory for the "house of Israel" (v. 11). To the watching world, and to the Israelites themselves they thought, "Our bones are dry, our hope is lost, and we ourselves are cut off!" (v. 11). In the midst of the valley of dry bones God asked Ezekiel, "can these bones live?" to which Ezekiel responded, "O Lord God, You know." (v. 3). The Lord commanded Ezekiel, "Prophesy to these bones, 'Hear the word of the Lord!" (v. 4). God said, "Surely I will cause breath to enter into you and you shall live. I will put sinews on you and bring flesh upon you, cover you with skin and put breath in you and you shall live. Then you will know I am the Lord" (v. 5,6). Ezekiel obeyed the Lord's command and behold, "there was a noise, and suddenly a rattling; and the bones came together, bone to bone... sinews and the flesh came upon them, and the skin covered them over" (v. 7,8). To the dry bones, to the nation of Israel, the Lord said, "I will open your graves and cause you to come up from your graves and bring you into the land of Israel" (v. 11,12). After 70 years of captivity, God indeed allowed for a remnant to return. Under the leadership of men like Ezra and Nehemiah, the city of Jerusalem was restored, and her walls were rebuilt. God's chosen people were not dead and buried. God's promises were not dead and gone. There also still existed a preserved seedline from the lineage of David. A "Shoot from the stem of Jesse, and a Branch" (Isa. 11:1). There was still an opportunity for a tender plant to grow up before Him, And as a root out of dry ground (Isa. 53:2).

HOPE FROM BEYOND THE GRAVE Ezekiel 37 is an epic chapter of Scripture that gives us vivid imagery that

brings great hope. Those things that we might think with man, impossible, are possible with God! David said this in Psalm 124 "If it had not been the Lord who was on our side, When men rose up against us, Then they would have swallowed us alive, When their wrath was kindled against us; Then the waters would have overwhelmed us, the stream would have gone over our soul. The popular worship song taken from this Psalm says, "Blessed be the Lord, who would not give us up, blessed be the Lord for His unfailing love.

The snare is broken and we have escaped. Our help is in the name of the Lord." David also said, "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me..." (Psa. 23:4).

Ezekiel's vision of hope was not the last instance of hope from beyond the grave found in Scripture. Jesus said, "Do not marvel at this; for the hour is coming in which all who are in the graves will hear His voice and come forth... (John 5:28,29). Jesus gave hope from beyond the grave. He demonstrated this literally in raising the widow's son from Nain (Luke 7:11-17). He raised Lazarus from the dead (John 11). Matthew even records that at the time of His resurrection, "graves were opened and many bodies of the saints who had fallen asleep were raised; and coming out of the graves after His resurrection, they went into the holy city and appeared to many" (27:52,53). Chiefly, Jesus, Himself rose from the grave, as He predicted, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up" (John 2:19). Though the widow's son was being carried away in a casket, Jesus brought life back to the dead body. Though Lazarus surely stank by the time He arrived He called him from beyond the grave. Though the soldier pierced Jesus' body, though His body was wrapped up like a mummy, on Sunday, up from the grave He arose! Though His enemies thought if they could kill Him they could kill His plans, He said, "the gates of Hades would not prevail against it" (Matt. 16:18).

(ONTINUE IN HOPE

What am I to conclude about the character and nature of God? What should my takeaway be? What things do I see as impossible? What things do I judge dead and gone? What things do I believe are beyond hope? With God, I need to think again. That is why I keep working on my relationships with friends, family, and coworkers. That is why I still pray fervently for those who have walked away from the truth. That is why I continue to strive to walk in the Spirit and not in the flesh (Gal. 5:16). Paul says because God can and has worked beyond the grave, our "labor is not in vain in the Lord" (I Cor. 15:58). When Jeremiah stood watching His beloved city burn to the ground He pinned this beautiful verse, "Though the Lord's mercies we are not consumed, Because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness. The Lord is my portion, says my soul, Therefore I will hope in Him!" (Lam. 3:23).



Not My Will, But Thine
I do not remember whining and complaining about the food I was forced to eat at the dinner table when I was young. I must have a hazy memory because now that the shoe is on the other foot my kids fight Tiffany and me tooth and nail when they are asked to eat certain things at dinner (who doesn't like mashed potatoes?!?!). I may not remember complaining when I was growing up because it would do me no good in getting my way. I still had to eat at least one good helping of green peas. Kids whining and complaining don't get much further in my house either. It is rather annoying listening to my sons say, "but I don't liiiike it!" Oh, that children would just let go of their own desires ("dude it's just mashed potatoes, they're not gonna kill you"). In Luke 22:39-46 we learn of another Son who was in a much more difficult place, faced with a cup of suffering prepared for Him. Instead of whining and complaining; instead of looking for another way out, the Son of Man said "not My will, but Yours, be done." There will be times you may not desire to fall in line with your mom and dad. In most things, it is safe to say moms and dads are looking out for your best, and it is in our best interest to listen to them. What we must absolutely learn from Jesus is submission to our heavenly Father. It is not about my will and my desire. Not my will, but Thine.
