# What Shall a Man Give In Exchange for His Soul?

When the tomb of Charlemagne (King of the Franks, 766-813) was opened in the year 1000, he was said to be wearing a purple robe, holding a scepter in one hand, and the withered finger of his other hand pointed to a passage in an opened Bible. That passage was what we know as Mark 8:36-37, where Jesus said, "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?" These sobering words of Christ give us occasion to remember some important truths about the human spirit/soul and the tragedy of its loss.

### The Spirit/Soul Is Immortal

The prophet Zechariah stated that "the LORD, who stretches out the heavens ... forms the spirit of man within him" (Zec. 12:1). The word translated "forms" means to fashion, or shape, as like what potters do while making vessels of clay (cf. Jer. 18:1-4). Humans, male and female, are exclusive among God's creation in that they are the only ones said to be made in the "image ... [and] likeness" of God (Gen. 1:26-27). The body was formed from the dust of the ground (Gen. 2:7a). It is physical and returns to dust at death. The spirit/soul of humans is not physical (cf. Lk. 24:39). The spirit/soul is from God (Gen. 2:7b; Eccl. 12:7), the "Father of spirits" (Heb 12:9).

Human nature can be viewed as three-fold: "spirit and soul and body" (1 Thes. 5:23). Although the "spirit" and "soul" are distinguishable (Heb. 4:12), they are inseparable and make up the human's "inner man" (Eph. 3:16). Thus, they can be spoken of as a sprit/soul unit. There are three inescapable truths about the human spirit/soul. First, it is not subject to death. Jesus taught that people could kill the body but not the spirit/soul (Mt. 10:28). Death occurs when the spirit is separated from the body (Gen. 35:18; Jas. 2:26). Second, since the spirit/soul lives eternally, so do all humans (Gen. 25:8; Jn. 5:28-29). Third, the spiritual place humans will exist eternally is determined by the choices made by our "inner man" (Jn. 20:29-31; Rom. 10:9-10; 1 Thes. 5:21-22).

# The Spirit/Soul Is Unique

In the Book of Job, Elihu spoke of the uniqueness of mankind, "But there is a spirit in man, And the breath of the Almighty gives him understanding" (Job 32:8). There are some major differences between mankind and animals. First, in the lineage of Christ, Adam was called, by creation, "the son of God" (Lk. 3:38). Nothing in the animal world was called the son, or offspring, of God. Second, at

death, the human spirit/soul "goes upward, and the spirit of the animal ... goes down to the earth" (Eccl. 3:21). This is another way of saying at death, "the dust will return to the earth as it was, And the spirit will return to God who gave it" (Eccl. 12:7). Animals have a different nature than humans! Third, humans are self-conscience. They can examine themselves (1 Cor. 11:28; 2 Cor. 13:5; Gal. 6:4) and discern right from wrong (Deut. 13:15-19), good from better (1 Cor. 7:36-38). Animals have no such ability. Fourth, human actions are self-determined by free will (Josh. 24:15; Mt. 7:13-14). Animal behavior is determined by instinct and physiological impulses. Fifth, humans are worshiping beings in that they will look to something, real or imagined, as an object of worship (Ex. 20:3-5; Jn. 4:23-24; Rom. 1:23). Animals are not worshiping beings. Sixth, humans are created to love God and voluntarily do His revealed will (Isa. 43:7; Eph. 2:10). Other than the role for which God created them (Col. 1:16), animals have no capability of loving God and/or understanding and doing His revealed will.

### The Spirit/Soul Is Priceless

The human spirit/soul is more valuable than the sum total of all this world's riches (Mk. 8:36-37)! This world and all its riches will all be gone one day (Mt. 24:35; 2 Pet. 3:10-12; 1 Jn. 2:17). Why is the human spirit/soul more valuable? First, it was given by God (cf. in His "image"); thus, made to survive death and live forever (Gen. 1:26-27; Eccl. 12:7). Second, Jesus shed His blood for our spirit/soul. Jesus did not come to give eternal physical life (Heb. 9:27), but eternal spiritual life (cf. Jn. 11:25-26; Heb. 2:9).

Although the spirit/soul is the most priceless possession, it can be and, unfortunately, is sold out by many people. Here are some of the more common reasons why people sell out their spirit/soul. First, some place more value on possessions, like the rich young ruler (Mt. 19:21-22) and the foolish farmer (Lk. 12:20-21). Second, some place more value on the pleasures of this life, as illustrated by the seed that fell among thorns (Lk. 8:14) and as exemplified by the once faithful Demas, who forsook the cause of Christ, "having loved this present world" (2 Tim. 4:10). Third, some place more value on popularity, like the Jewish leaders who believed, "but because of the Pharisees they did not confess Him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue; for they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God" (Jn. 12:42-43). Rest assured, however, whatever people may get in exchange for their spirit/soul, they have made a foolish trade! Neither the world nor all its riches can satisfy (1 Tim. 6:9-10 cf. Eccl. 12:13). Neither the world nor its treasures will endure (Mt. 6:19-20). Neither the world nor its treasures can be taken into eternity (Job 1:21).

## The Spirit/Soul's Loss Is Most Tragic

Not only is the loss of the human spirit/soul tragic because of its inherent value described above, but there are also other tragic consequences that make this loss the most tragic. First, the loss of one person's soul may be responsible for the loss of other souls. Consider the rebellion Korah, Datham, Abiram. It was not just those three spirit/souls who were lost but a total of 14,700 souls were lost as a consequence of that incident and the people who murmured against Moses and Aaron because of it (Num. 16:1-46). Even the rich man was afraid his brothers would be eternally lost because of his example (Lk. 16:27-28). Second, lost souls tragically pay dearly in this life as well. They are separated from any spiritual blessing (Eph 1:3), which

means they have no mediator in prayer, no fellowship with God and His children, no comfort from above, and no hope of eternal salvation! Third, the loss of the spirit/soul is an entire loss, irreversible (Lk. 16:25-26), forever (Mt. 25:46), and without compensation (2 Thes. 1:8-9).

### Condusion

Charlemagne is to be commended for having his dead body buried so as to point to the value of the spirit/soul. Only God knows his eternity. The good news for us is that our soul need not be lost! God's plan of salvation has been from eternity, and He cannot lie (Titus 1:2). What is the condition of your soul today?
